As we wrap up another exciting term, we reflect on the wonderful learning and growth our tamariki have experienced over this action packed term. From captivating classroom learning to many engaging experiences outside of the classroom, our students have showcased creativity, resilience and an enthusiasm for learning.

I want to acknowledge our hard working staff who consistently go above and beyond to create a safe, inviting and enjoyable learning environment at our school.

Thank you also to all parents and caregivers for your continued support.

We are incredibly proud of our students' achievements both big and small and the supportive community that surrounds them.

You will have read a lot about attendance this past term. It is one of our strategic goals but you may have noticed that is also a national priority.

Last year's end-of-year academic results showed promising progress in different areas. It also highlighted the impact that COVID and attendance has had on achievement. At the end of last year, 63% of our students were At or Above for Reading, 57% of our students were At or Above for Writing and 60% of our students were At or Above for Maths.

We are committed to meeting the diverse needs of our tamariki. However, we rely on your continued support. Please ensure that your child attend school regularly, arrives on time, and is not taken out of school early, unless absolutely necessary.

Rate of attendance	Number of Students attending	Percentage of students attending
Regular attendance (90+%) Excellent work	386	59%
Irregularly absent (80-90%) Goal: Get to 90+%	152	23%
Moderately absent (70-80%) Goal: Get to 80+%	58	9%
Chronically absent (Less than 70%) Huge concern	58	9%

We want to maintain or even improve our attendance even during the winter terms. We appreciate the improved efforts everyone is making to get their children to do.


Please keep this up - wind, rain or shine! We understand some life happens, and some things are outside of our control but we love our tamariki to be at school every day they can- this benefits them socially and academically!

Our daily attendance rate across the

term was **88.4%**

Every day we have 3% of our tamariki unaccounted for (i.e. they are absent and we don't know why). This means they will be regarded as truant. It is most appreciated if we know of a child's absence in advance (the best way is to use the skool-loop app to inform us of absence).

We're observing a concerning trend of higher absenteeism on Fridays and Mondays (see below). This suggests families extending weekends or recovering from them which is a pattern that we want to address and mitigate.



We have seen great success with sending the fortnightly update of student absences so will continue this initiative throughout the year. A reminder, if we already have reasons for absences listed already you don't need to reply to us (it's still good for you to read the email though as a way of monitoring your own child's attendance at school).

What is the Reading Together Programme?

Reading Together® is a research-based workshop programme which helps parents/whānau to provide effective support for their children's reading (and thereby also supports teachers in their classroom programmes).

The programme has been shown to raise children's reading achievement in a significant and sustained manner, and to improve relationships between children and parents, and between parents and teachers
